COMMAND POST AND TWENTY FIXED LOCATIONS ESTABLISHED IN CAMDEN AND MANNED EVERY SATURDAY AND SUNDAY. SUBJECTS SURVEILLANCES OBSERVED; SUBJECTS PHOTOGRAPHED; AND THEIR COMMUNICATIONS MONITORED AND RECORDED. AT TWO THIRTY A.M., SUNDAY, AUGUST TWENTYTWO LAST, GRADY GROUP COMMENCED BREAK-IN CAMDEN P.O. LAST, PAGES OF GLASS USED FOR PRACTICING DRILLING; NUMEROUS OTHER  
ITEMS OF EVIDENTIARY NATURE.

RAIDS AND ARRESTS TREMENDOUSLY IMPRESSIVE AND SUCCESSFUL -  
WIDESPREAD NATIONAL RADIO, TV, AND PRESS COVERAGE HAD AND STILL  
CONTINUING - HIGHLY FAVORABLE AND COMPLIMENTARY TO FBI.

RESULTS OBTAINED BY SPECIAL MEDBURG SQUAD IN PHILA. HAVE  
SEVERELY CRIPPLED ORGANIZATION QUOTE EAST COAST CONSPIRACY TO  
SAVES LIVES UNQUOTE AND MAY WELL HAVE DELETED THEIR FINANCIAL  
RESOURCES, BRING ABRUPT END TO THEIR QUOTE RIP OFFS UNQUOTE AT  
FEDERAL OFFICES THROUGHOUT EASTERN U.S.

AS THE BUREAU IS AWARE, THIS HAS BEEN A MOST DIFFICULT AND COMPLICATED INVESTIGATION. NEW LEFT ACTIVIST HAVE MANY SYMPATHIZERS IN ALL WALKS OF LIFE. EXTREME DIFFICULTY HAS BEEN ENCOUNTERED IN GETTING PERSONS TO COOPERATE AND FURNISH INFORMATION CONCERNING THEIR EXTENSIVE FEDERAL OFFICE BREAK-INS AND COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT BREAK-INS. THE PERSONNEL ASSIGNED TO THE SPECIAL MEDBURG SQUAD OVERCAME MANY DIFFICULT OBSTACLES, SUCH AS CONDUCTING INVESTIGATIONS AND SURVEILLANCES IN QUOTE HIPPIE UNQUOTE NEIGHBORHOODS AND IN NEIGHBORHOODS COMPLETELY DOMINATED BY QUOTE COMMUNES UNQUOTE. THE CITY OF CAMDEN, N.J., HAD RACIAL DISTURBANCES BEGINNING THE NIGHT OF AUGUST NINETEEN, AND THE MAYOR OF CAMDEN INVOKED A CURFEW FROM EIGHT P.M. TO SEVEN A.M. - NO MORE THAN THREE PERSONS ALLOWED TO BE ON ONE STREET OR IN A VEHICLE. THIS NECESSITATED A MOST DISCREET AND COMPLICATED PLAN IN ORDER TO MOVE EIGHTY/SPECIAL AGENTS INTO THE CITY OF CAMDEN WITHOUT VIOLATING CURFEW LAWS AND NOT BEING DETECTED BY THE SUBJECTS OR ANY OF THEIR SYMPATHIZERS. THIS WAS FURTHER COMPLICATED DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE CAMDEN P.O. BUILDING IS LOCATED IN A GHETTO TYPE AREA - RESIDENTS PRIMARILY PUERTO RICAN AND NEGRO, WHO WERE ALL ACTIVE IN THE RACIAL DISTURBANCES THAT BEGAN AUGUST
